OMEGA PSI PHI FRATERNITY, INC.

Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. is the first international fraternal organization founded on the campus of a historically black college.

On the evening of November 17, 1911, Omega Psi Phi was founded inside the Science Building (later renamed Thirkield Hall) at Howard University located in Washington, D.C. The founders were three undergraduates — Edgar Amos Love, Oscar James Cooper and Frank Coleman. Joining them was their faculty adviser, Ernest Everett Just.

From the initials of the Greek phrase meaning, “friendship is essential to the soul”, the name Omega Psi Phi was derived. That phrase was selected as the motto and Manhood, Scholarship, Perseverance and Uplift were adopted as Cardinal Principles.

Since its founding in 1911, Omega Psi Phi's stated purpose has been to attract and build a strong and effective force of men dedicated to its Cardinal Principles of Manhood, Scholarship, Perseverance and Uplift. The Centennial Celebration in 2011 recognized the impact of the Fraternity in communities world-wide over the previous 100 years and reiterated Omega Psi Phi's commitment to providing unparalleled community service and scholarship.

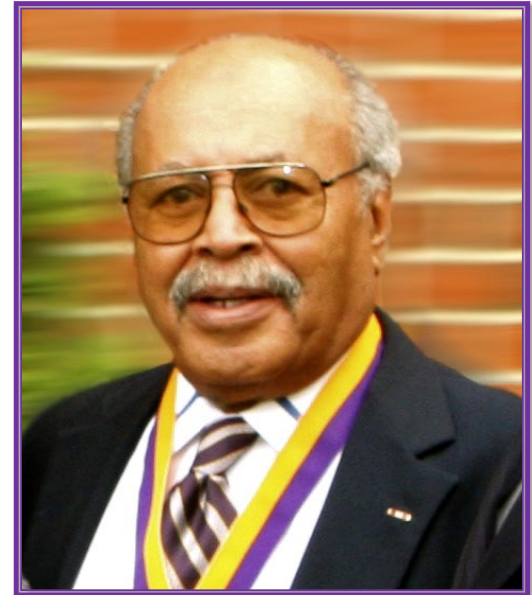

Brother Franklin Dunlap was one of the early members of Pi Lambda Lambda. A dedicated patriot, Brother Dunlap served more than twenty years in the United States Army and was honorably retired as Senior Noncommissioned Officer. He had a special affinity for young people matriculating through middle and high school with their hopes set on going to college. Dedicated in his memory, the Franklin Dunlap Memorial Scholarship specifically targets young African American Males to honor the legacy of African American young men who overcame significant social and economic obstacles and graduated from college in the years leading up to and beyond the Civil Rights Movement.
