APPLICANTS MUST


- Be enrolled in a Prince William County or Stafford County school

- *Enroll in a junior/community college or 4-year college/university for the fall semester of 2025
- Have a minimum, cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale

Background: Although pardons are a common practice for departing presidents, how they're used is subject to debate. Controversy surrounds both President Biden's historic number of Presidential Pardons as he approaches the end of his term in office. Across the aisle, President Elect Trump has promised to pardon persons convicted in the January 6, 2021 attack on the U.S. Capitol. The stark difference in the volume and use of the Presidential Pardon has increased interest in how pardons are being used and who is getting pardoned.
